
**Changing traffic patterns through Fall 2015.
EXPECT MAJOR DELAYS or
Use I-695 or I-895 if traveling thru Baltimore City.**

Southbound I-95

- On or about Sat. **March 28** for approx. 8 weeks: Southbound I-95 traffic lanes will split after the Fort McHenry Tunnel with two lanes to the left and two lanes to the right. Stay right for Exit 55 (Key Hwy.), Exit 53 (I-395) and Exit 52 (MD 295) prior to entering the Fort McHenry Tunnel. Thru traffic stay to the left. **E-ZPass is accepted in all toll lanes.**




- Date to be determined; for approx. 6 weeks: Traffic will shift to the right between I-395 and Exit 50 (Caton Ave.).



NOTE: All dates and times are approximate and dependent on weather or other work related variables.

Northbound I-95

- On or about Sun. **March 22** for approx. 6 weeks: Traffic will shift to the right just north of Exit 50 (Caton Ave.).



- On or about Mon. **March 30** for approx. 8 weeks: Northbound I-95 traffic lanes will split with three lanes to the left and one lane to the right at Exit 54 (Hanover St.) to Exit 55 (Key Hwy.). To use Exit 54 or Exit 55, you MUST be in the right lane prior to the split. Traffic entering northbound I-95 from I-395 will use Fort McHenry Tunnel Bore 4 (right tube). **E-ZPass is accepted in all toll lanes.**



Commuters leaving Baltimore City should use Key Hwy. to enter northbound I-95 to help minimize delays.

Stay Alert So No One Gets Hurt!

- Seek alternate routes during peak travel periods (6-9 a.m.; 3-7 p.m.; Mon. - Fri.).
- Work-zone speed limits on northbound and southbound I-95 are reduced to **50 mph**.
- Work-zone safety speed cameras in use.
